13 Reasons Why Book Discussion

- 1. Overall impression-- what did you think of the book? What did you like, what bothered you?
- 2. Consider the title of the novel. Are each of Hannah's thirteen reasons of equal importance? Which do you find to be the most unexpected?
- 3. Discuss the adults in this book. Clay's mother gave him space, was that right? How did you see Hannah's parents role? Did any adult respond in a way that was helpful? Why does she open the truth of her story to only one adult, Mr. Porter in particular? How did the book present adults?
- 4. Is the atmosphere of the school and teens in the book authentic, or like our school?
- 5. What about mental health was accurate, what was missing?
- 6. Jay Asher's intent in writing the book was to create an awareness of teen suicide and the dangers of bullying. Was he successful?
- 7. Discuss these themes in the the book and how realistic they are in actual teen life:
 - Repercussion- cause and effect of behaviors
 - Betrayal
 - Gossip and reputation
 - Lack of parent awareness/interaction
 - Subjugation of female body
 - Revenge
- 8. What impact, if any, do you see the novel or the series having on teens? What message will they take from the book?
- 9. What impact has the book or series had on parents and adults?
- 10. An alternate ending, where Hannah lives, was published in the 10th Anniversary Edition. What does it say about media/society that a more dramatic ending was chosen for the book and the series?
- 11. What will you remember from reading this novel?
