# Classroom Guidance: Organization

Grade level: 2<sup>nd</sup>
Time: 30 minutes

### **ASCA National Standard:**

Standard A: Students will acquire the attitudes, knowledge and skills that contribute to effective learning in school and across the life span.

### Materials/Resources:

2 trays of school supplies—one organized, one messy The Berenstain Bears and the Messy Room, by Stan and Jan Berenstain Worksheet- Organization

## Activity:

- Discuss the term "organization"
   Ask students what it means to be organized.
   Ask students how being organized can help them at school and at home.
- Gather students in a circle. Uncover the messy tray of school supplies; give them 30 seconds to look at the tray silently. Students return to their desks and write down as many items as they can remember from the tray. Review items and how many they remembered seeing.
- 3. Read the book and discuss.
- 4. Brainstorm a list of places that get cluttered easily: desk, bookbag, garage, play room, bedroom. Talk about solutions for these places.
- 5. Gather students in a circle again. Uncover tray of organized school supplies; let them study it for 30 seconds. Students return to their desk and write down as many items as they can remember.
- 6. Ask: What was the difference between tray one and tray two? Which tray was easier to remember and look at? Why? Discuss results.

### **Evaluation:**

Have students write down one area they are going to organize this week, and the first step to getting this done. Students share their goal with a classmate.
